Upcoming Town Board Topics & Activity MONTH OF OCTOBER 2020

2021 TENTATIVE BUDGET: I have released the Tentative Budget which we will vote on

tonight to accept as the Preliminary Budget for 2021. We will again have to exceed the State imposed Tax Cap. Oddly enough this year the "Tax Cap," which is implied as a straight 2%, is actually 1.0027% per the State Comptrollers office. We will exceed that, although minimally, by 0.6%.

In regards to the General Budget most of the increases come from increases in salaries reflecting the increases in the minimum wage (which as of January 1 goes up another 70 cents per hour to \$12.50). The minimum wage is due to increase at this increment each year until at least 2022 or when the entire state meets the \$15 minimum wage.

In consideration of this and out of respect for those who have put in the time and worked up to their current rates, I'm raising all employees who are under \$15 per hour the full 70 cents while other employees raise approximately 40-50 cents per hour.

I have increased a few elected officials roughly3% (Supervisor, Town Clerk, Highway Superintendent and Assessor Chair) but minimally (roughly \$1,500).

Other increases come from Retirement and Healthcare as they are projected to rise a near 3% increase in Retirement, a \$5,000 increase and near 4% in Healthcare which amounts to a \$10,000 increase. The General Tax increase for 2020 is projected at 1.66%.

On the Highway Budget does not have many changes. We do have cost increases regarding salt for the winter so we are adding more to that line in the budget. Even though we are in contract negotiations we do not anticipate any raises to be beyond what is already budgeted. Outside of that are increases on Medical and Social Security costs. The Highway Budget tax increase stands at a 1.66% increase.

Phoenicia Water District we do anticipate higher usage as we've seen a higher population increase, especially during this time, but we also want to create a Capital Savings account for future Capital Improvements to the District. I'm adding a \$10,000 line item for their budget to help build that account. This creates a 3.24% increase in the tax.

Pine Hill Water District tax will remain the same at this time.

The Fire Districts: Pine Hill/ Highmount is anticipating a roughly 1.7% tax increase while the other Fire Districts remain unchanged.

All said and done spending is going up 1.5% with a combined overall tax increase of 1.52%. The increase means that, barring any change in your assessment, for every \$500 in Town Taxes you paid this year, next year your rate will go up by roughly \$7.60.

We will hold a Special meeting on Tuesday, October 20th @ 1pm to adopt the law allowing us to exceed the Tax Cap. We will also be holding our annual Budget Public Hearing just prior to our next Board meeting scheduled for 6:30pm on Wednesday, November 4, 2020, the evening after Election Day.

SHANDAKEN SEPTIC DISTRICT: We are in receipt of the funds, over \$5 Million, in

order for the Town to take total control of the Shandaken Septic Maintenance District (SMD). We will be hiring the necessary personnel (attorney, engineer, contractor) to continue operation of the SMD and to complete work previously outlined for the completion of the SMD. Once the work on the remote systems is complete, we will be going out to bid for a contractor to be on stand-by for any work that needs to be completed in the future. This will be a new Page on the Budget, as it a legally taxable District, but no taxes are anticipated at this time. The SMD should be self-sufficient with the existing fund transferred to the Town.

BUILDING: Mr. McGowan has presented an updated Fee Schedule for Permits in Town. The Planning Board has reviewed them and sent their approval. We have a resolution tonight to adopt those updated fees. These fees are still less than surrounding Towns but closer what we need to meet increasing work in that department.

HIGHWAY: The Highway Super, Mr. Hofmeister, has made a request to replace some outdated equipment for his Department. We will be advertising for a used road paver and are looking to purchase a new 1 & ½ ton Single Axle Pickup (hopefully with a plow) for service in the Highway Department. Our resolution tonight approves of these actions which are within his existing 2020 Budget.

MISC.: Lastly, we have our Annual Halloween Curfew Resolution. We are unsure of what type of Halloween this will be, but we still request that everyone stay safe, follow social distancing guidelines but also understand the need for children to still be able to enjoy the holidays as they approach. A simple solution being bandied about is party bags instead a communal bowl of candy.

Our next regular meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, November 4, 2020 at 7:00 pm.
