

Shandaken Summer Recreation COVID-19 Safety Plan

GOAL: Offer a healthy and safe environment for the children and staff of Shandaken Recreation Program ranging in age from 5 -15 years old in order to provide a recreational and educational outlet, while providing further protection for visitors to the facilities being utilized.

- 1) ALL Counselors will be required to sign a document recognizing protocols and procedures to ensure safety of the campers, themselves and the general public including:
 - a. Wearing of masks during non- waterfront or recreational activities where social distancing cannot be maintained.
 - b. Use of Hand sanitizer by campers and themselves
 - c. Recognition of any symptoms that may develop with campers or themselves
 - d. No co-mingling of groups in order to maintain groups at no greater than 10 including counselor.
 - e. If child is suspected of or begins exhibiting symptoms, child will be brought to the attention of the Camp Director or Assistant to contact/follow up with parent/guardian.
- 2) ALL Parents/Guardians shall be required to do and understand the following:
 - a. ALL Children shall come with a facemask.
 - b. Shall sign in their child every morning attesting to the following:
 - i. Parent has tested child's temperature and does not exceed 99.9° F in past 24 hours
 - ii. Child nor family members have/are not exhibiting any of the following symptoms: coughing, shortness of breath, fever, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or loss of smell.
 - iii. Child nor family members have not had close contact with a person confirmed nor suspected of having COVID-19 in the past 14 days.
 - iv. If child develops any symptoms or tests positive for a heightened fever during the course of the day, Camp will contact Emergency contact person from file and require child is picked up outside the entrance to the facility and to contact their personal healthcare provider.
 - v. In such case that child has exhibited symptoms, they will not be allowed to return to Camp until Camp receives written medical clearance from healthcare provider. If none provided, child may not return to Camp for a minimum of 14 days.
- 3) Camp Director or Assistant will check temperatures of campers prior to entry on busses or into facility for those being dropped off directly daily.
- 4) Groups WILL NOT exceed 10 (including counselor) at any time.
- 5) Masks shall be worn by all whenever possible and where practical and reasonable. Campers/Staff will wear masks while at Facility when unable to social distance or utilizing restrooms.
- 6) Multiple groups may be involved in a similar activity as long a social-distancing requirements are maintained between groups.
- 7) Counselors will do their best to seat children in their groups while utilizing public transportation.
- 8) Camp will provide its own sporting equipment for recreation and equipment will be sanitized between uses by different groups.
- 9) Camp will alternate locations for different activities by groups in order socially-distance groups as best as possible.
- 10) Camp will provide emergency PPE available for all campers and staff at all times.
- 11) Director or Assistant will be stationed near facility's Main Office to respond to any issues that may arise and to provide a central location point for counselors to check in and provide any change status updates.
