SUPERVISOR'S NOTES - JUNE 2022

This month we are looking to pass our STR law, plus an attendant fee structure. We also have summer Recreation going forward this year starting July 5th headed by the very able Manny Jean Pierre. We will be rehiring she and a support staff this month as well as setting up contracts with ORDA and UCAT for transportation to and from camp, the beach and field trips.

We are still diligently working on getting a stormwater retrofit system in Pine Hill but that needs yet another engineer study for the grant application to be complete. At this point, we are looking at the Firehouse property. We are also bringing the Pine Hill Fire department into a mutual aid agreement with Ulster County Department of Emergency Services.

Once again, we are looking and investigating the idea of moving the Town Hall and Highway garage out of the flood zone. DEP has offered a 5-acre parcel just east of the

current property. We will have to do a feasibility study and find money to build these facilities. I'll keep you all posted with any updates. This will take some time.

Lastly, we are protesting NYSEG raising rates as drastically as they did since last December. We have a resolution stating such and a petition here as well as on our website for residents to sign. Our Next Meeting in Monday July 11th, 2022.

Anyone that has been on Route 28, or traveled through one of our hamlet centers in the past two weeks will know that our tourist season is in full swing. As this brings many benefits to the Town, the increased transient traffic brings a heightened risk for motor vehicle accidents and particularly, automobile – pedestrian, and automobile – bicycle accidents. According to the CDC, more than 7,000 pedestrians lost their lives on roadways in the year 2020. That's one auto – pedestrian death every 75 minutes. As we have been very fortunate over the past couple of years, there have been quite a few instances of auto-pedestrian accidents over the past ten years here in Town with some resulting in poor patient prognosis.

Be sure to have a heightened awareness while driving through hamlet centers on busy weekends, and if out on the road be sure to walk on a sidewalk or path instead of the road. Walk on the shoulder and facing traffic if a sidewalk or path is not available. Also consider avoiding the utilization of electronic devices like earbuds, which can cause distractions while walking. If walking at night, increase your visibility by carrying a flashlight and wearing bright, reflective clothing.

COVID UPDATE-. As of 6/5 there are no active cases of COVID in the Town of Shandaken! Total cumulative cases in the Town since the beginning of the pandemic have reached 327, with 326 recovered. There is still only one fatality accounted for in the Town. There are 260 active cases of COVID in Ulster County, with cumulative cases in the County reaching 43,417. There are a total of 384 cumulative fatalities since the beginning of the Pandemic in the County, and a total of 42,773 individuals recovered.

and Request for Investigation Against NYSEG**

Whereas the Town of Shandaken and its residents receive their electric and gas utility service from New York State Electric and Gas Corporation (NYSEG); and

Whereas it is the responsibility of the utility provider as prescribed by New York State Public Service Law PBS § 65 to provide safe and adequate service and just and reasonable charges; and

Whereas the costs of these utilities have risen exponentially, up to 60% higher since the month of December 2021 causing undue burden on customers; and

Whereas the Town Board of Shandaken has heard continuous complaints from residents as to the impact of these sudden increases; and

Whereas the Town Board of Shandaken has determined the current rates charged to customers by NYSEG to be untenable and unjustly inflated; and

Whereas NYSEG has erred in its responsibility to reasonably notify customers of these projected increases and ensure consumers are protected from price volatility in the market; and

Whereas it is the duty of the Department of Public Service and Public Service Commission to ensure consumers rights are protected and safeguarded from such issues, and

Whereas this body has the power under New York State Public Service Law § 71 to formally file a complaint and request for investigation regarding the price of these services on behalf of its constituency; and

Therefore, let it be resolved that the Town Board of Shandaken calls upon the Department of Public Service to initiate an investigation into the rates of NYSEG under Section 71 of the Public Service Law.

RESOLVED, that the named Fire Agency shall respond to all calls for assistance from another Fire Agency through the Ulster County Communications Center also known as UC911; and be it further

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Shandaken, hereby acknowledges and accepts its financial responsibility pursuant to applicable law; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution shall be filed with the Ulster County Department of Emergency Services.
